Old Business

Trustee Webb reported that he submitted a letter last week to Sheriff Altieri's Office concerning a Township noise ordinance.

A Work Session was held on September 21, 2015, with Farmington Trustee Martha Yoder, and Fire Chief John Bland, Bristol Fire Chief Tom Dempsey and Bristol Trustees were all present. The purpose was to discuss proposed terms for fees for EMS service to Farmington Township. Mr. Webb outlined the position of Bristol Township to charge Farmington Township for all EMS squad runs into Farmington Township. Mr. Webb presented a report prepared by Bristol Townships EMS billing service that showed the number of runs into Farmington Township since January 2015 and the amount of dollars billed but not paid for by insurance or Farmington Township.

Martha Yoder went over the points outlined in a proposed contract between Farmington and Bristol Township as outlined in a letter from the Farmington Board of Trustees to the Bristol Board of Trustees.

- Initiate a formal contract for Mutual Aid Services
- The contract would allow for payment of EMS runs not reimbursed by a Farmington resident's insurance at \$300.00 and that any billing done for these runs be accompanied by proof that they have not been paid by the residents insurance.
- That the contract allow for the payment of paramedic assist at \$150.00 and EMT assist at \$50.00

The Bristol Trustees thanked the Farmington Trustees for their proposal. After discussion of the points it was agreed that further discussion would be needed to settle on terms of an agreement. It was decided that further information would be needed to write a contract between the Townships.

- Term of the agreement
- Dollar amount charged per run for EMS Service
- Determination of billing cycle
- Retroactive to June 1, 2015

Bristol Trustees decided to write a draft proposal over the next two weeks and send it to the Farmington Trustees for review. Upon review a meeting will be scheduled to discuss the proposed contract. Work Shop adjourned at 8:00 PM

The attached proposal and letter will be sent to Farmington Township.
